Romantic Road

The Romantic Road is a simple two-way country road that connects Würzburg in the north to Füssen in the south. It was originally an old Roman trade route turned into a tourist attraction that will take you through medieval towns, luxurious palaces, historic landmarks, and towering cathedrals. If you're on a romantic trip, this is the perfect little road trip to take together through Germany!

Starting in Würzburg, you'll begin in the Franken wine-growing region. This town is famous for its delicious wines and gourmet restaurants. If you are going to start your romantic journey with one thing in this city, it must be the Residenz Palace. It is considered one of the three most beautiful castles in Europe, competing with Versailles in France and Vienna Schoenbrunn.

Many visitors claim that Rothenburg ob der Tauber is the most romantic stop on the romantic road, as its the best-preserved medieval city in Germany. This beautiful walled town is decorated with pastel cottages, an abundance of flowers, and a ton of wrought iron signs. If you have enough time, make sure to hike up the Rathaus Tower for a panoramic view of the town. Otherwise, walk around town and snack on the various sweet treats at the bakeries around town.

Another fun stop on the Romantic Road is Nordlingen which has such a fascinating history. The entire town was actually built in an impact crater from a meteor that struck Germany many ages ago. This is the perfect town to stop in if you want to add a little unique history to your romantic travel to Germany from US.

Heidelburg

Heidelburg is a university town and a popular tourist location, best known for the Heidelberg Castle and Alstadt (Old Town). There is so much to do here; you can climb and hike the hills nearby if you're looking for fun, romantic activities, and great city views. You won't want to miss the main attraction of the sandstone Heidelburg Castle which was originally built in 1214 and has been struck by lightning twice and restored on several occasions.

In addition to the castle, you'll want to check out the old town squares and enjoy the cute streets together, where you'll find many shops, cafes, and quiet places to relax. Finally, for a romantic stroll, you can walk along the Neckar river and get a great view of Heidelberg Castle. Along the way, you'll see the Karl Theodor Bridge, which may be Germany's most visited bridge. This stone bridge dates back to the 18th century and is a perfect backdrop to your travel in Germany.

Tübingen

This southern German town is frequently named one of the most picturesque towns in the country. It's a traditional university town that carries young energy but is captivating and beautiful. This town was recorded as early as 1078, and as you wander the cobblestone streets, you'll see that Tübigen is well-preserved. Fortunately, it was mostly left alone during WWII due to a high concentration of hospitals.

The best way to explore this beautiful and romantic town is on foot and explore every narrow alleyway, and admire all the half-timbered homes. In the heart of Tübingen, you'll find the Market Square that is home to Neptune's Fountain, fresh produce, and fresh flowers. Another romantic option is to stroll the Neckarinsel, which is an island in the Neckar River. Here you can admire the 200-year-old planar trees and even pack a picnic.

Bamburg

If you're looking for the perfect fairytale charm with a village feel, Bamburg is your city in Germany. This city has cobblestone streets, river crossings, forests nearby, and intricate detailing on the buildings. So much of the town has kept its historic medieval features, buildings, and structure that UNESCO classified it a UNESCO historical site. You and your significant other can explore all the best sights on foot.

You'll definitely want to check out the Green Market for an afternoon picnic in this romantic town. Keep your eye open for the Neptune fountain, the most famous fountain in Bamberg, created in 1698. Keep walking until you see the Old Town Hall – it's covered in murals crafted by Johann Anwander that you cannot miss. Continue walking around town to find the Bamberg Cathedral, which was founded in 1004. If you and your partner love wandering around old towns and exploring historical buildings, Bamberg is definitely the town for you. There's so much more to see than what's been listed here!

Berlin
